ITE 3-Year Higher Nitec Course

New 3-Year Higher Nitec

ITE will introduce a new 3-year Higher Nitec full-time programme from Academic Year 2022.

Streamlining the current Nitec and Higher Nitec curricula, this new option will allow students to attain a Higher Nitec qualification directly, in only three years instead of the current four years.

Normal (Academic) and Normal (Technical) students can apply for this new 3-year Higher Nitec programme using the existing Nitec entry requirements.

For students who have accepted ITE EAE offer

ITE-EAE (for 2 year nitec or 3 year higher nitec courses)

- When your child has accepted an ITE EAE offer, he or she is deemed to be admitted into the school (must meet Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs)) and will not be allowed to participate in JIE after GCE 'N' Results
- However, if your child (from 4NA) qualifies for Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) / Secondary 5 (O Levels) or Poly Foundation Programme (PFP), he or she can still apply for these courses, and to withdraw from ITE EAE once placing has been confirmed. PFP application opens in January, hence students applying for PFP may progress to ITE first, and may withdraw from their ITE course if they eventually secure a place in a PFP course.
- Students who wish to withdraw from the conditional offer must do so before the stipulated deadline.





Term 1 and March Booster Programme

The Booster Programme aims to help students who are struggling in specific subject areas, particularly in the English Language and Mathematics.

It is a structured programme to guide students to enhance their content and skills mastery and also serves as a platform for students to clarify their doubts and to consolidate their learning.

Sessions for the Booster Programme will be conducted face to face.

May to June - MT & Coursework
 Intensive Programme





- Limit his/her time spent on digital devices.


